Darlene Bonczkowski, beloved daughter, mother, sister, aunt, niece, life mate and friend died Saturday, March 11, 2023, in Portland, Oregon. She was 55 years young.

Darlene was born Darlene A Gause in 1967 in Philadelphia, PA, to parents Shelley and Jerry Gause. In 1982 at the age of 15 she moved to St. Louis with her mom Shelley and brother LR.

After graduating high school, Darlene was finding her path forward and future career. As a Cheer Leader for a professional indoor soccer league, The St. Louis Storm in the early 90's, she was afforded great opportunities. Moving to Oregon in 2020 to be close to her mom as well as join Eric and begin a new journey, she found a new career as well working in the Providence Health System, winning the respect and love of her new work family until her passing.

Darlene loved the great outdoors. Exploring Oregon and all it had to offer was a new passion.
