Edward E. Heilman, beloved husband, dad, grandpa, and great grandpa, passed away on October 21, 2010. Ed passed away at his home on the farm in Oregon City with his children at his side.

He is survived by his wife of 59 years, Darlene (Sosnovske) Heilman; his sons Ron and Ed Heilman and their wives Chalileo and Lisa, respectively; his daughter Pat Benjamin and her husband Loyd; his daughter Janeen Dillow; twelve grandchildren; thirteen great-grandchildren; sisters Louise Jubb and Lorene Todd; and many close friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents Fred and Rose Heilman; his brothers Ernest, Elmer, Harold, and Ervin; and his sisters Elma, Edna, Clara, and Elfreda.

Born on July 27, 1932 in Redland, along with his twin sister, Edna, he was a lifelong resident of Oregon City. In his early years, Ed met the love of his life, Darlene. After Ed graduated from Oregon City High School in 1950, he and Darlene were married in 1951. He worked as a logger and then at Publisher Paper Mill, but his passion for farming soon became a reality. Ed began raising breeding turkeys and cattle full-time in the late 1950's. He and his family moved to their farm in the Carus area in 1962. In 1975 his son, Ed, joined him on the farm and they worked together on Heilman Farms until his

passing.

Ed was a lifelong member of Trinity Lutheran Church of Oregon City. He was a pillar of strength for his family and friends, always ready for a laugh (and usually the one causing the laughter). Although he will be greatly missed, he now resides in heaven with our Lord and Saviour.
