After high school, Gil began a career as a fire fighter/EMT for Gresham and Fire District 1. Preferring to avoid, 'sitting around the station in between calls,' he began a career in law enforcement with Clackamas County Sheriffs Office first as a deputy, next as a detective. Gil retired 3 years ago after 24 years, receiving numerous awards for his service.
