JOE SALAS, JR. passed away unexpectedly on April 9, 2009 in West Linn, Oregon. He was born in Santa Barbara, Calif. on June 16, 1948 to Ane (Rosales Salas) Rodriguez and Joe Salas, Sr. Although his employment took him to various cities, he always considered Santa Barbara as his home. Joe was a fun, loving husband, father, and friend to many. He devoted much of his time to various organizations including the 20/30 Club and the Goleta Lions. He also served as treasurer of Pacoima Chamber of Commerce and as President of MEND (Meeting Every Need with Dignity) in Pacoima, California, receiving recognition awards from both the State Senate and City of Los Angeles. Joe loved all sports, both as a participant and a spectator. He coached local tennis teams, girls' softball teams, and many youth teams. He especially loved coaching his son in all of his activities.
