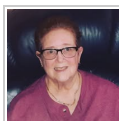
“ My only brother John, 51 days after a heart transplant at OHSU, passed away November 25th. I have never known anyone who fought harder to overcome the many complications he encountered in the ICU. No one wanted to live more than he did. He had experimental heart surgery at age 48 at UT Southwestern in Dallas, Texas. We were told then not to expect him to live. And he did. Several times in the past years we have been told he wouldn't live more than a year or two and one time he was literally sent home to die. And he fooled them. He drove to Oregon over 3 years ago to live near his children and grandchildren. He was pretty much at death's door when he arrived. He went into St. Vincent Providence hospital and survived another big LVAD surgery. Through all those years he was told he was too sick to get a transplant. Then his children encouraged him to walk, eat healthy and just being surrounded by them and his precious grandchildren motivated him to become healthy enough to be listed on the transplant list a year ago. So to me he's the bravest, strongest man I've ever known to not give up and to fight his hardest to be here with and for his children. John was 61 years old. I wish I had remembered to tell him how proud of him I was. Rest in peace John Wesley Gore Jr. You were an annoying little brother but you were well loved. Our mom and sister and I will miss you terribly. You are now without pain. I will miss your sense of humor the most. Love, Barbara
