She volunteered wherever she could: Roosevelt High School clean up with SouthLake Church, Greenacres Farm Sanctuary, baking snacks for church service, or cooking "dinner with the pastor" for a new church plant. Judy was a fabulous cook!

If you knew my mom, you knew love! Be at peace now, mom. No more pain and you're with daddy again. Watch over us always. I love you so much mom and I'll miss you always!

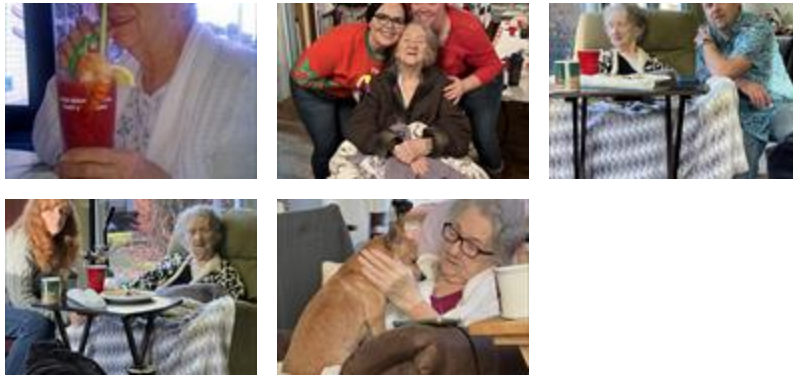
