*Kelly, Lila Jean 84 12/03/1926 12/27/2010 Lila was born Dec. 3, 1926, in St. Ignatius, Mont., to William Davis Foust and Katherine Irena Foust. Her education began in Jerome, Idaho; and continued in Corbett and the Oregon City area. She attended the one-room Upper Logan School, Eastham Grade School, and Oregon City High School (class of 1945). She also attended Northwest Nazarene College in Nampa, Idaho, for one year. Lila first entered the workforce at age 16, working at the Foundation Woolen Mill as a spool operator. She then began her secretarial career. She worked for Wherry Tailoring Co.; U.S. Maritime Commission/War Shipping Administration; Marshall Wells Co.; Uney & Jacobs, Attorneys at Law; and Oregon City Church of the Nazarene. While working for Marshall Wells Co., Lila met Keith Calvin Kelly. They were married Aug. 20, 1950, and were together for 57 years. They have one daughter, Wilda. Lila was a member of the Oregon City Church of the Nazarene for 71 years. Most notable during that time, were the many years that she and Keith worked with the children of the church. In 1983, they were honored with a Distinguished Service Award. Lila and Keith were also active in the Oregon City community. In 1998, they received a certificate in recognition of their work on the McLoughlin Promenade. Then in 2004, they were named Citizens of the Year. Soon they will be recognized again, with a plaque at the entrance of the McLoughlin Promenade. Lila passed away Dec. 27, 2010. She was a kind and loving woman, and will be greatly missed by all who knew and loved her. She was preceded in death by her husband; parents; and brothers, Paul and Percy Foust. She is survived by her sister, Wilda Cropper; daughter, Wilda Gurney; grandsons, Michael and Mark (Jenny) Gurney; and great-granddaughters, Sky, Kelly, and Jenna.
