The life of Lorraine

Lorraine Ella Noack was born on June 9, 1931 in Gresham, Oregon to Ernest and Emma Noack. She was raised in rural Sandy, along with her brother Melvin. Her extended family included many cousins including Delores and Doris, who she played with, worked with (picking hops) and kept in close contact with over the years. The family moved to Salem, and Mom attended school, graduating from Salem High School in 1949.

Mom met Roy Beugli in Salem, though we don't know the when and where story. If anyone who reads this knows that story, we would love to hear it.

They were married on September 2, 1950 at St. John Lutheran Church in Salem. In their young married life, they lived in Salem, Bend and Corvallis. Their first child, Ramella Christine, was born in 1952; then two years later, came Debra Ann. At this point, their third child, Michael was still in the distant

future.

Roy and Lorraine lived on Hoffman Rd in Salem near many friends and relatives. While there, Mom cared for their two children and oversaw the household, while Dad supported the family. It was a time of family life, music (Mom's brother Melvin played in a Country Western band), love and laughter. There were also many camping trips to Breitenbush Hot Springs and Honeyman State Park.

The family moved to Vancouver, then the Portland area where they lived until 1968.

While living in North Portland, Mom helped care for her parents, who lived down the street. In 1966, Michael Sean joined the fold and completed the family.

In 1968, the family moved to West Linn. This was a very happy and active time for Mom as she became involved in the Oregon City Elks, worked as the 'lunch lady' at Mike's grade school, joined the Campseekers group with Dad, played cards, bowled in a league and just enjoyed life.

Mom was a big game player. Dad's inspector friends met to play cards every month, Jim and Dee were regulars for weekend pinochle, Mom played Bingo

at the Elks and Bunco at the Gladstone Senior Center. She really enjoyed the penny and nickel slot machines on trips to Reno and Las Vegas. 3-13 was a favorite family game whenever we would all get together at the cabin. As she got older, she kept her hands busy by playing a handheld Poker machine. What a party girl!

Mom loved road trips – she and Dad made many trips to Reno with their family and friends. Mom, Dad and Mike took a trip to Canada and to Disneyland, as well as many camping trips with the Campseekers. Mom's favorite trip was when she and Dad flew to Seattle, shuttled to Victoria BC, then got on a cruise ship that went down to Los Angeles. In 1979, Mom and Dad bought property in Lyons, with Uncle Norm and Aunt Grace where they built a small cabin and a quaint outhouse. Many fun, happy times were had there over the years with campfires and singing. This is where Dad's ashes were scattered, and this is where Mom wants hers to go as well. She was a faithful Mariners fan, watching nearly every game, even when they didn't do too well. Mom and Ramella would be on the phone when there was a wonderful play or when they won the game. She'd be disgusted when they lost, but she continued to support them. In the last month or so, they would watch the Monday night games that would play prior years' games. She was looking forward to when baseball season started up again.

Family was always important to Mom. She enjoyed Christmas celebrations with brother Melvin and family, then her own family as it grew, loved attending annual reunions with the Teetz family, and looked forward to monthly luncheons with the Beugli family. Her children and grandchildren held a

special place in her heart, and they were all there for her near the end of her life.

Mom leaves her daughter Ramella, and her children Jason and Ralyn Miller; daughter Debbie (husband Brent Johnson), and their children Emma and Kari, son Michael (wife Carrie) and their children Haley and Kody.

We learned from her the value of family, and are truly thankful to have shared in her life. It was a special blessing that God gave us to have her move in with Ramella the last couple of months of her life. There were many occasions during the last two weeks that we were all there to spend time with her and each other.
