Mack Leonard Smith, affectionately known as "Smitty," passed away peacefully at his residence in Oregon City, Oregon, on February 6, 2026, at the age of 94. Mack was born on May 15, 1931, in Miller River, Washington, and he was raised in Arlington, Washington, where he moved with his family in 1935.

A proud graduate of Arlington High School, Class of 1950, Mack was known for his excellent athleticism and dedication to student activities.
