Milton Carroll Woolridge died on March 8, 2009 in Oregon City at Willamette Falls Hospital due to complications from cancer.

Chuck was born in St. Joseph Missouri and made his way to Oregon. In the spring of 1965 he met and married Gloria Torrence; they were married for nearly 44 years. He drove truck for a living and during his career worked for Risberg, McCracken Bros Motor Freight, Blue Bell and Raz Transportation. During his life he enjoyed fishing, camping, family genealogy and was always generous helping his family. During the holidays Chuck enjoyed volunteering his time as Santa Claus and would appear at children's hospitals, nursing homes and various schools. He became known as the "truck driving Santa" and appeared on the national television show Real People and locally on PM Magazine. He attracted people with his willingness to share stories and his relentless humor.

He is survived by his wife Gloria Woolridge, sons Robert Woolridge, Doug Woolridge, Kevin Comstock and daughters Kathy Tweet and Cheryl Krause. Grandchildren 7 ; and great-grandchildren 2. He is predeceased by his
