



Randy William Weitzel

Randy graduated in 1967 from Franklin High School in Portland, Oregon. After graduation Randy attended Portland Community College. While attending PCC Randy continued to work at Norcrest China Co.; a job he started while in high school. During his time at Norcrest Randy met Jean Scurlock, who he later married in 1972. After leaving Norcrest in 1970 Randy worked as a computer operator at Hudson House, a grocery wholesaler, until 1973. In 1974 Randy went to North Pacific Lumber Co. as a software programmer. After 29 years with North Pacific Lumber Randy retired and started the Oregon Trail Soap Company.

He is survived by: wife, Jean Weitzel and sons, Joel and Seth Weitzel.
