“ My name is Rich Pierce I first met Terry in Vietnam. He was our company commanders radio man, we shared living quarters on Hill 52 and became good friends. I left Vietnam in May of 68 and often thought of him and how he was doing. I started a family and went on with life, did not hear or see him again until he showed up at our reunion in Twin Falls Idaho in 2008 and that was a great reunion just because he was there we had a great time discussing our adventures and mishaps. Our worlds came full circle. The following year the reunion was in my home town Columbus Oh. Terry stayed with me that time. The last time I saw him was in 2014 after our reunion in Kalispell Montana, He drove his new motorhome around the country stopping in Chicago to visit another marine and then came to my house with a couple of friends and spent the night then continued on his trip to the Grand Canyon and then back to Oregon. Shortly after his return he went back in the hospital I talked to him on the phone and he passed out. That was the last time we spoke. Terry enjoyed the reunions a lot he felt comfortable with other marines. I have been asked about him at least a hundred times from other friends and marines and not able to answer them. I now know Terry did not tell us about all his health issues to keep us from worrying about him, he had a lot of self pride but I wish he would have told us how bad things were. He was loved by all who knew him and we are so thankful for those years we were able to share in his life.
